“The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed.”

Two New Shelter Homes!

Each year Mission Possible is entrusted with resources and dedicated staff to accomplish our mission, of helping the oppressed know the freedom that is in the Lord. Our shelter homes, which house over 100 children a year, are essential in providing for these seemingly shattered lives.

Last month was unforgettable as we opened two new buildings in Russia. We celebrated the inauguration of a rehabilitation home for street children, youth, and young mothers in Ekaterinburg. In St. Petersburg, where we already have a children’s crisis home, we opened another large building to house children who will be staying with us until they turn eighteen. This will double our capacity in the city.

A Couple’s Happy Story

Nightmarish life on the streets

Lena had been living with her alcoholic parents on the streets of Moscow for several years when our patrol found her. She, along with other young boys and girls, approached our patrol car for the food we offered them. Our street team reached out to help Lena, who, in spite of her young age, had experienced all the horrors of street life.

At eleven years old Lena was one of the first children to come to the newly established Moscow shelter home in 1998. She attend-

ed school after being prepared in a special class we arrange for children who have fallen behind their peers academically.

Slowly she healed from her traumatic past, and so much so that this girl, who had suffered unimaginable pain, was able to forgive her parents and fervently pray for them.

Lena grew up, finished school, and chose cooking as her profession. She has been working in the kitchen at the Moscow shelter home, serving the new generation of children who have come after her.

Three years ago we celebrated the first wedding in our shelter home in Moscow. While at Mission Possible's rehabilitation centre on the Yaroslavl farm Lena met Roma, a young man enrolled in our two-year drug rehabilitation programme. After Roma's graduation from the programme the two married and have made their home at our Moscow base where both are working.

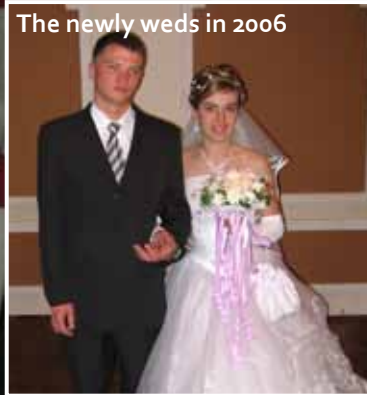
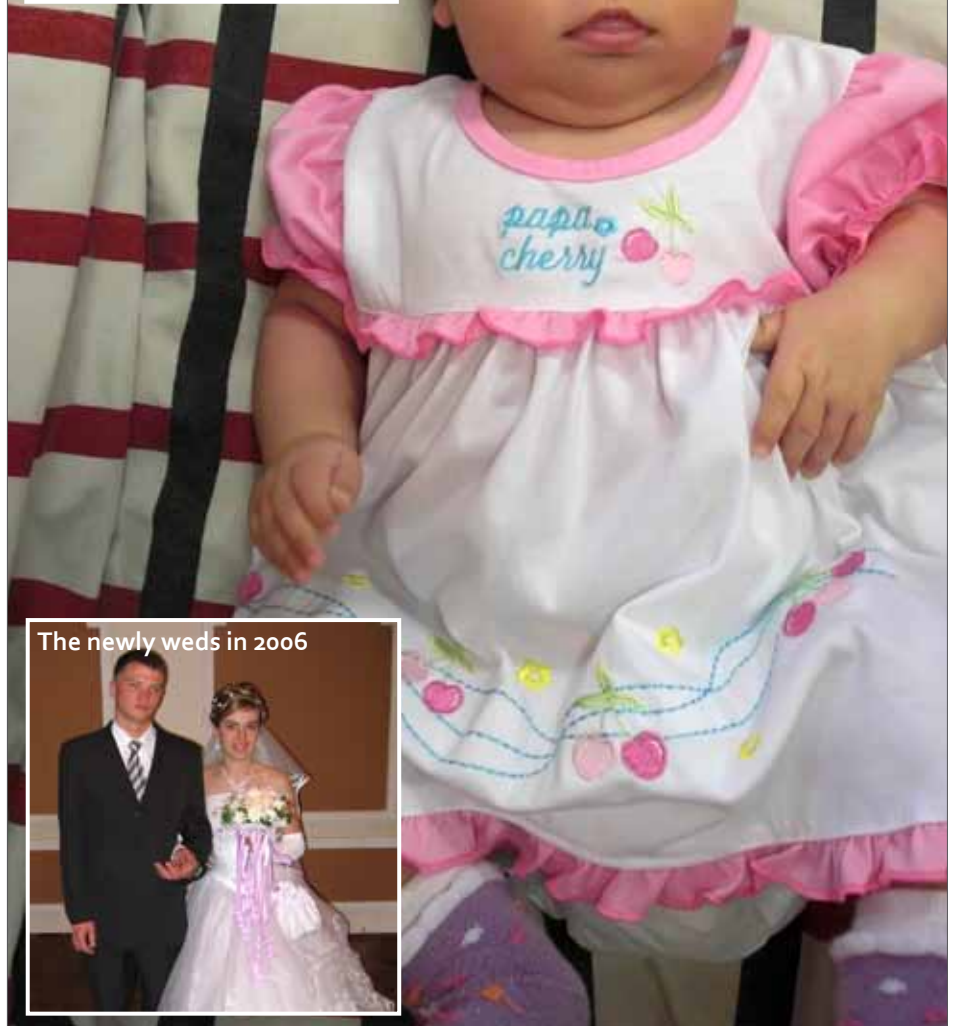
